Philip Yancey recounts a story that happened during a conference on comparative religions. Experts from around the world were discussing Christianity's unique contribution amongst world religions. Some suggested "incarnation" - but it was eliminated because other religions had gods appearing in human form. Another suggested "resurrection" but other religions also had accounts of returns from the dead. The debate went on for some time until CS Lewis walked into the room (and seriously how cool would that be?!!) and they asked his opinion of Christianity's unique contribution - "That's easy," he replied "It's grace." Mic drop. The notion of God's love coming to us free of charge and no strings attached seems to go against every human instinct. Other religions - including the Covenant from Judaism offer ways of earning approval but the revolutionary New that Jesus brought dared to unleash unconditional approval. This Sunday we continue our Re:New series contrasting the new that Jesus brought with the habits and ways of relating to God that we've grown attached and comfortable with. We'll listen to a reformed "rule keeper/ approval earner" named Paul, share how he did a 180 in his relating to God after meeting Jesus and let the obsolete ways of his past - go.
