AN UPDATE FROM GIOVANNA!

It was great to see everyone at church over the Christmas break. It still feels like family being at NRCC. I really want to thank everyone for praying for me and with me as God has led me to this place in BC. I just wanted to send an update especially to give a glimpse of what it's like here, and to highlight some praises and answered prayers.

Thanking God that I have started working since September. I accepted a position with the provincial government working in Child and Youth mental health as a counsellor. I was really impressed with the work that they are doing in assisting with reconciliation in First Nations communities - keeping children out of care and with their families, providing counselling for families, and working with bands in the communities to heal from intergenerational and historical trauma. The work that I am doing is specifically with children with mental health issues - anxiety, depression, psychosis, personality disorders, etc. It is sometimes tough work, especially to see kids who feel that they have no hope, who try to commit suicide, or who have really distorted ideas about their body image. I would ask for prayer in how to gently guide the youth to the Truth that can set them free. Sometimes it can be difficult to talk about God because of the hurt of the past with some of the youth who are from First Nations communities. What I do appreciate is that anyone can access our counselling and it is free, and youth here are very open about seeking out counselling.

I would like to say a big thank you to everyone that prayed for my dad as he went through treatment for prostate cancer. He went to the doctor about a month ago for check-up after the final phase of treatment, and was told that he is now cancer free. Praise God!
