

This week - we're looking at the everyday grace of Kindness. Last week we talked about forgiveness and most people will say that forgiveness is hard and that we can't do it without help! But when we get to KINDNESS - most people will say - I'm reasonably kind. It's not that hard. Not very many people think they have trouble being kind. It's hard to find someone who says - "Yeh, I'm an unkind person."

So why does Paul think KINDNESS is so important that he mentions it specifically in his writing to the Christians in Corinth and Ephesus? What's so hard about kindness?

I read an article by a movie critic in which he said that many actors get to a place in their career that they want to play characters who are simply purely kind and good. He also said those movies tend to be really bad! He went on to say something that got me thinking - he said, "Actors forget how hard it is to make extreme goodness - dramatically interesting." Maybe Paul gives kindness significance because it's easy to be artificially kind but real kindness requires a SHIFT?

Sunday morning - we're looking at how a Supernatural grace changed heart shows itself in living out kindness. You can check out Paul's words in <u>Ephesians 4:29-5:2</u> Hope to see you then!
