

- > Pray for our healthcare workers Nurses, Doctors, First Responders. Please remember them and their families during this stressful time at work and when they return home.

#### GREETINGS FROM JOE & LOREDANA ANTIGNANI SERVING AS MISSIONARIES IN ITALY:

We are doing fine. it was a little difficult knowing that we would have to remain at home for at least another two weeks. Then we discovered this will be extended till who knows when. Celeste will most likely not return back to school. I get out and do the shopping once a week with a mask and gloves. I must bring along with me a signed permission form indicating the exact motive for being out. There are no problems with food deliveries to the grocery stores but the items we pick up often have not even been put on the shelves yet, they are still on pallets. There were only some hoarding for a couple of days but then it tapered down. We must just get used to lineups.

The only problem is that we can't leave the town of San Marco in Lamis (13,000 inhabitants) where there is only one small grocery store for everybody. There are many corner stores, and fruit and vegetable vendors in the streets. The price in the smaller stores are higher, and we shop only about once a week so we cannot look for sales, and we buy whatever is available here in San Marco. The street vendors/farmers that sell fruit and vegetables are priced ok, but this is also changing. San Marco normally relies on the 4 very large grocery stores in San Giovanni Rotondo area which is about 6-7 kms away where food is economical and worth stocking up. The problem is we can't leave our town as there are police road blocks so we are forced to shop here and to be grateful for whatever we are able to get. We are nevertheless eating well.

I started teaching English in December to businessmen and engineers at a factory about 1 hour away. This was 1 day a week for 6hrs. I have always worked part-time. The support for the work in Europe is often underfunded due to the elevated costs compared to areas in the rest of the world. We are the only ones left with our mission in Italy. This work would provide from 35-40% of our support. Just before the Virus hit, Cambridge School got the part time contracts for two high schools, one in San Marco in Lamis and San Giovanni Rotondo, only minutes from home! This didn't ever get off the ground and all schools were closed, including the factory where I was already working. This is all from the 19th of February.

Thousands and thousands have been charged for gathering outside their homes. Young people who have drug or alcohol problems are caught gathering secretly. This is a felony and one can get fined, and also up to 3 months in jail. Over 60,000 have been charged already in Italy. Something that probably didn't happen in China which is why we feel they have Covid-19 under control today, but who knows. We don't want to condone all of China's strategies

The deaths in 24 hour periods have been sad - world record highs. Difficult to understand how those who lose their loved ones feel. They would not see their elderly (some not so elderly) parents again, from the day they are brought to the hospital often with simple flu symptoms, to the day they die. Sometimes 7-12 days pass by, where only in 2 or 3 of these days (not always) they receive phone calls from their parents in the hospital, then they are put on respirators and they don't hear from them or see them again. Some have lost mothers and fathers together within a 24 hour period and never saw or heard from either of them from the day they arrived to the hospital. They aren't allowed near the hospitals to see the sick, nor are there funerals allowed. Very sad situation.

We believe there is a tilling of the soil of the hearts of the Italians going on. I called the dentist office as they were treating and trying to save a tooth of mine. Obviously they were closed. I spoke to the dentist's wife and she knows what I do, and she asked (again) about the Lord, and permitted me to send her an audio biblical message. Things are happening, people are softening.

We are airing Biblical messages on our church's whatsapp group. I will be recording messages for Thursday night bible studies. We also do conference calls on whatsapp for up to 4 people at a time so people don't feel lonely.

May the Lord use this all for His glory in Italy.

We are a little concerned about Joshua (in Hamilton) as he is alone and was laid off yesterday due to the virus. He says no problem he can handle it. If this carries on for a long period he could get lonely.

Thank you committing to praying for us. I appreciate this.

Please greet the congregation on our behalf. Very fond memories.
