Please remember to return your Shoeboxes this Sunday - November 11th so we can take them to the shipping location for delivery next week!




> Christmas Unplugged!

Hospitality!

When we see or hear the word "Hospitality" most of us probably think of entertaining or hosting friends or family for dinner or maybe of the service that a hotel provides. But the original word hospitality is a compound word that contains two incredibly powerful concepts that include "brotherly love" and "alien or stranger". So instead of simply being understood as "entertaining guests" the word becomes "one who loves strangers/immigrants like you would your own brother." That's a big difference, and completely changes the way we see this term. In fact that word is used over and over again in the New Testament, indicating that one of the hallmarks of a Jesus follower is a radical love for those we are unfamiliar with — expressing it the same way we would love our own brothers or sisters! Wow! Practicing authentic Hospitality is an expression of the Good News of how Jesus has radically reshaped us and brings us together as One family! Nashville Road Community church is a people who are living out the love of God and whether we gather in our homes or at the church building we want to be with that kind of authentic hospitality that includes a genuine welcome but goes beyond what our culture settles for. As Jesus says - goes the extra mile!

So - we're looking to recognize, raise up, and release a team of people to express that kind of family hospitality - particularly right now for when we gather on Sunday mornings! Imagine walking into the building and you, your family and friends feeling instantly and genuinely welcomed, comfortable and at home! We want that to be an ever increasing reality as we live out the love of God!
