#### **GATHERING IN PERSON:**

In order to comply with regional health guidelines for worship gatherings and create seating that allows us to safely utilize the capacity of the auditorium and provide for contact tracing if it becomes necessary - we are asking people to please pre-register <u>each week</u> for Sunday inperson gatherings. <u>CLICK HERE</u> to let us know how many in your household or "bubble" will be attending with you and sitting together. Greetings from San Giovanni Rotondo!

The last three months have been a busy time in ministry with preparing the church in San Giovanni Rotondo to meet once again physically. We have encouraged many churches that were discouraged as they were concerned about the decrease of members participating online during the lock-down. The same thing was happening with the church in San Giovanni Rotondo. We had further news that on the day the lockdown ended, the church in San Giovanni Rotondo had been broken into and the computer, audio system, sound board, video projector and microphones were all stolen, but we all stayed calm pushed forward by faith.

We shared this with other churches to help them also push forward with hope and faith. Then we finally had our first Sunday meeting and church attendance was almost complete. Who preached had to really raise their voice. Now it has been over three months since we began meeting physically and attendance has increased and the church body is engaging. There were also two conversions, a psychologist from the large hospital here and has been attending regularly together with one of her patients, who is also a long-time friend of the church. They are both really tuned in and are engaging. We are grateful as the church building has the capacity to accommodate everybody comfortably and safely, and there is still some space for visitors.

We were the only open church in the province amongst the brethren assemblies. You may take this last sentence two ways. One we have been open, meeting physically, for over 3 months now, and two we are open having shed a lot of the legalism. This has gone far and above, and quicker, than what we ever thought would happen. The Lord is good! Joe has been bringing regular messages that reveal legalism and its' consequences, and to replace it with the only alternative, walking in freedom in Christ. The long time elder Pasquale is excited about the changes taking place. There is some real stretching required in the church to receive the generation Z youth and not see them or treat them like aliens because of their aesthetics and looks. They are indeed human and have needy souls, and Christ went to the cross for them too (Acts 15:7-11; different situation same concept). Nothing has changed, every generation thinks they've got it all right.

Loredana is doing a wonderful job with the women as they are the real strength of the church, and now this reality is being channeled more effectively. Together they do regular programmed visits to homes of members. When they gather for tea and coffee they also involve those who don't know Christ personally. They are reaching out with joy!

The church in Salerno has just finished up renovations to their rooms in church having added also a bathroom downstairs so they can now hold two separate activities at the same time. There are two new people that have just joined the church recently. We pray that the members continue to reach out and make new friends in the area, and implement a discipleship program. The problem they are having is that some want to meet physically immediately and others would rather wait as any new infections discovered in the church would cause an immediate closure and a 14 day quarantine period for everybody that was present at the meeting. Many families cannot afford this to happen due to the financial strain the lockdown has already had on many. A very difficult situation. Due to the recent increase in infections the many churches that have been close since March will not even contemplate opening at all for now. Salerno nevertheless opened the doors last Sunday with only a small group due to the fear of being infected. We continue to visit our numerous friends and contacts in Salerno that we have made over the years. Two families are particularly open to hearing the word of God.
