We live in a "post-Christian" culture. Many studies and statistics illustrate that youth and young adults, who as children attended church, no longer do so. One such study called "Hemorrhaging Faith" (a study of youth and young adults in Canada) states, "Of the young adults who no longer attend church, half have also stopped identifying themselves with the Christian tradition in which they were raised." In the book of Judges we read that when Joshua's generation had taken the promised land passed away, "...another generation came after them who didn't know the Lord or the things that he had done for Israel." (Judges 2:10-12). These are sobering words, but also ones that demand an examination.

This Sunday we're excited to welcome Jenn Aspilla to teach and she'll be looking at how we can successfully pass the baton of our faith from one generation to the next. She'll help us look for clues in 2 Timothy 1 where we find Paul's final words to Timothy - his beloved spiritual son. We read how the faith was handed down from Lois (Timothy's grandmother) to Eunice (his mother) then to Timothy himself. We're looking forward to being one in spirit and purpose as we worship together!
